Organic land care places the needs of the land, in the form of the water, soil and ecosystem, at the center of any design process, landscaping project or maintenance plan

The Organic Land Care Standard can be applied to all types of landscapes and natural and created environments, including home gardens, parks, campuses, woodlands etc., in urban, rural and suburban settings under human management, and includes the use of edible and ornamental plants.

The Organic Land Care Practitioner:

- Works with natural systems and processes to encourage and enhance biological diversity and native habitats.
- Optimizes and maintains the life supporting properties of soil, air and water.
- Utilizes renewable, biodegradable and recycled materials from local sources and minimizes waste.
- Considers the wider social and ecological impacts of landscapes and the practices and products used to create and maintain them.







The Organic Land Care Standard is a technical and goals based document that was first introduced by SOUL in 2003 to address the need for a tool to support a successful transition toward sustainable land care practices by individuals, community, industry and government.

The Organic land care standard is updated regularly to remain in alignment with the Canadian Organic Standard.

Professional Certification:

SOUL administers two levels of organic land care certification for horticultural professionals, both of which are held by the professional who obtains them, rather than relating to a specific site, product or business. Your designation will stay with you as you move between projects, employers or provinces in Canada.
